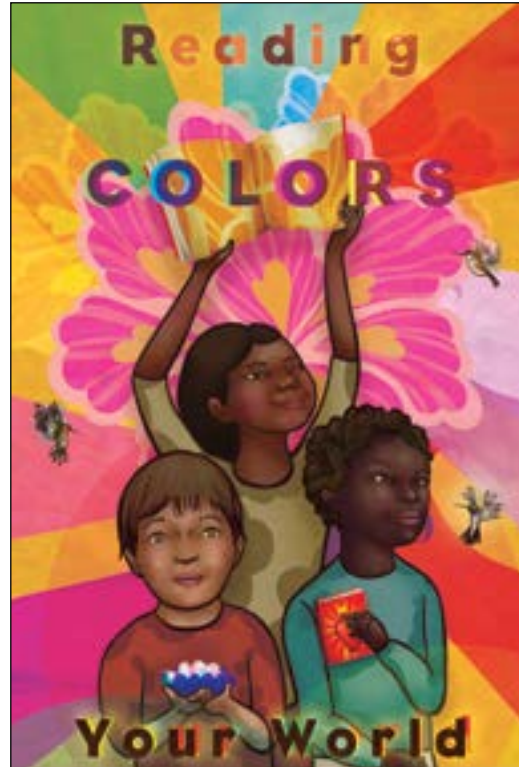


OLIVER JEFFERS



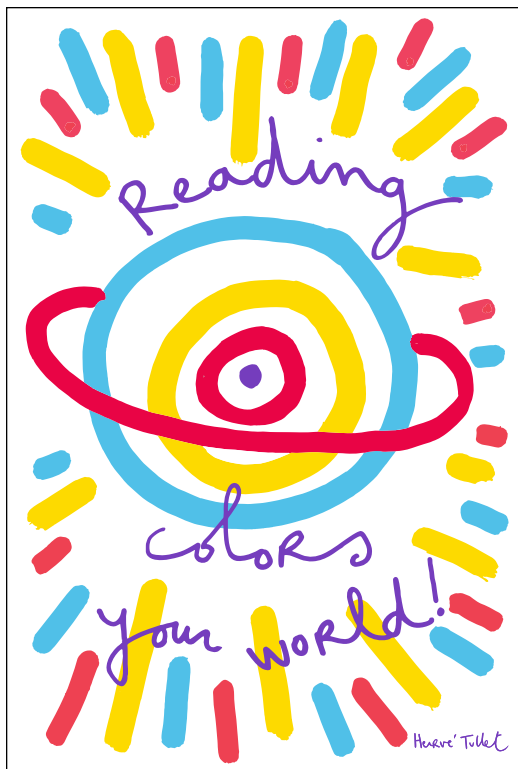

YUYI MORALES



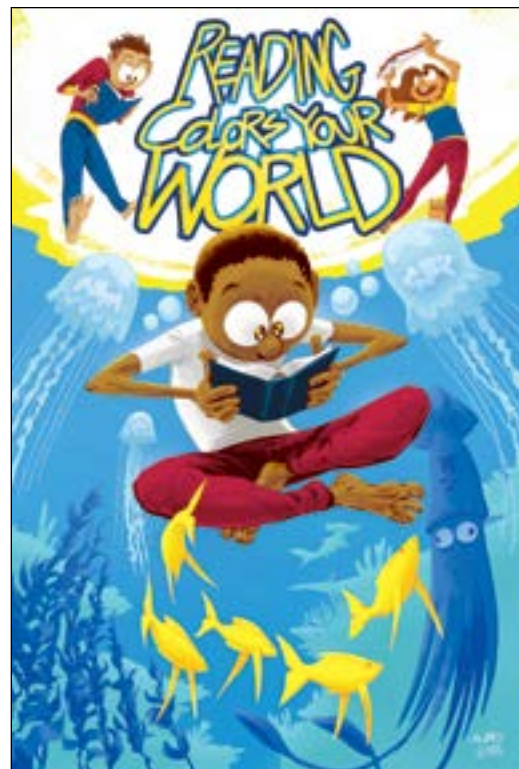



Developed by the Illinois Library Association, the program is adopted in other states including Minnesota, California, and Alaska, and worldwide by the Department of Defense for libraries on military bases. iREAD is implemented in thousands of individual libraries across the country. WHY Should I Use iREAD? iREAD is run by the Illinois Library Association, a nonprofit entity; revenues are used to support libraries. There are NO membership fees, contracts, or

commitments necessary. iREAD is flexible; you can use the art in perpetuity after purchase. We provide themed templates for any commonly used registration software package. We have a proven track record of success since 1981!

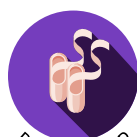
MOVIE CAMP
