- Timelines in the states differ; shipping schedule is available on the store site at ireadprogram.org








Find Your Voice

Criteria for Theme

Include the word "book," "read," or "library" (or related)

Lend itself to strong graphic interpretation Have appeal to preK-8 students, YA, adults, and library staff
